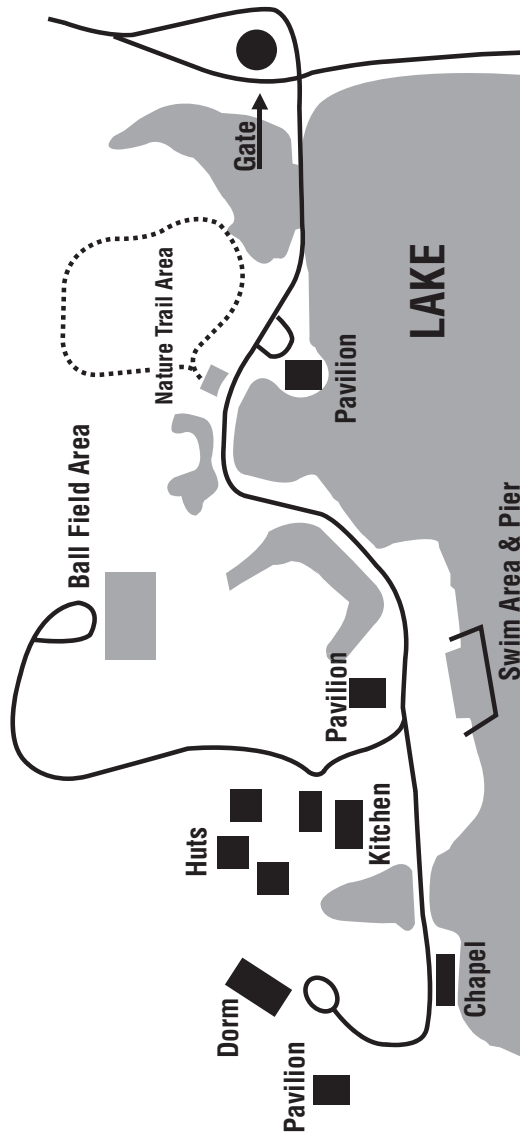

Group Camp Information:

The group camp is located on the east side of the lake to insure the groups have privacy. The group camp area consists of a dormitory with meeting room, three (3) individual huts, dining hall, chapel, large and small pavilions, private area for swimming (lake swimming, NO lifeguard on duty; swim at your own risk) and a large, open, all-purpose field for athletic and sports events. There is volleyball, basketball, and horseshoes available. A fire ring with seats (circular style amphitheater) is located in the group camp area.

DORMITORY AND HUTS:

The dormitory sleeps a total of 104 people with 52 on each side (separated by gender) with the meeting room in the middle of the building. The meeting room has a fireplace, drink machine, refrigerator, and cabinets with sink. The huts sleep 14 people each (total of 46 people) and all sleeping quarters are bunk style. Buildings are heated and cooled. *All Huts will be used only on an overflow basis unless approved by the manager.*

GROUP CAMP MEALS:

All meals are served cafeteria style. Food may be geared to age and type of group. All menus are carefully planned by the park. The park will work with the group concerning the menu as long as the menu falls within budget parameters. A complete count of campers for meals must be received no later than five (5) days prior to arrival. Food charge is based on camper count. Dining hall can be used for meetings but all groups must be out of the dining hall thirty (30) minutes prior to night ranger going off-duty at 9:00 p.m.

RESERVATIONS:

Reservations may be made 24 months in advance. *No dates are held or pre-reserved for individuals or groups.* Deposit is required at the time of the reservation. Consult park office for current list of fees. A transfer fee is also applied for transfer of dates (arrival or departure) or to another date. NO REFUNDS granted.

BALANCE/PAYMENT

Balance of account is expected upon departure. Any organizations or groups wishing to be invoiced for payment must make prior arrangements for payment.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

May 20 to September 10

- 40 people minimum
- 2 night stay per person
- 6 meals per person

September 11 to May 19

- 40 person minimum
- 1 night stay per person
- 3 meals per person

GROUP CAMP RATES:

- MEALS: \$6.50 per meal per person
- LODGING: \$6.50 per night per person
- Add 7% Mississippi Sales Tax to the Lodging Rates and 8% Sales Tax to the Meals Rate
- Rates subject to change per Public Notice

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Group camp guests are responsible for damages to all units and equipment. No furniture or equipment shall be moved from one dorm, hut, meeting room to another.
- 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. is considered quiet hours. During this time, the park will be closed to the general public with the exception of registered guest.
- Pets must be restricted on at least a 6 foot leash. Pets are not allowed in facilities.
- In congested areas a 15 mph speed limit or other posted limits will be enforced.
- Swimming is allowed in designated areas only. There will be no lifeguard on duty, swim at your own risk.
- No camping trailers or tents will be allowed in the group camp area.
- Use of dining hall or chapel must have prior approval of park manager.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- One side of the dormitory is handicap accessible.
- Kitchen area seats 150 people comfortably.

CAMP BLUEBIRD CHAPEL

The **Camp Bluebird Chapel** was donated to Mississippi State Parks / Paul B. Johnson State Park on October 14, 1990 by the Telephone Pioneers of America and Forrest General Hospital. *Renting of the Group Camp facilities does not include rental of the chapel.*

- Groups may request time(s) and Date(s) for the use of Bluebird Chapel. Upon request, the park staff must know the reason of use and its function.
- Request may be denied without reason given. (Request for meetings, skit shows, etc. will be denied).
- Upon departure from the chapel a ranger will inspect the facility.
- No drinks or food allowed inside chapel.
- Banners, materials, and /or objects can not be tacked, taped, wired to the walls, ceiling, or fixtures within the interior or exterior of chapel.
- Prior approval must be granted for use of piano, pipe organ, or PA system.
- No use of tobacco or alcohol products allowed inside the chapel. (Alcohol is not allowed in the lake area).
- No rice, seed, or other materials may be thrown in the chapel or chapel area.
- Damage incurred from use will be repaired or cleaned at your expense. Private contractors shall be utilized for this repair or clean-up
